

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course is designed for pain practice team members including physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, psychologists, nurses, occupational and physical therapists and others interested in clinical pain management.

At the conclusion of this symposium the successful learner should be better able to:

- 1 Explain the biopsychosocial mechanisms involved in the progression from the acute pain state to the disease of chronic pain.
- 2 Describe cutting edge methods of computerized pain assessment and tracking to improve functional and psychosocial pain management outcomes.
- 3 Differentiate between "disability" vs. "impairment" and appreciate the challenges involved in the appropriate assignment of functional impairment ratings and disability determination.
- 4 Evaluate the efficacy data for and concerns about advanced interventional procedures, including kyphoplasty and approaches for visceral pain management.
- 5 Tailor strategies for addressing complicated clinical scenarios including options for patients who have multiple medical comorbidities, persistent aberrant medication behaviors, or opioid-induced hormonal changes.
- 6 Summarize the recently-proposed changes to diagnostic criteria for fibromyalgia and identify evidence-based treatment algorithms with indicated medications and multidisciplinary care.
- 7 Explore ways to achieve pain management practice efficiency/financial stability goals and expand social media marketing strategies to meet the demands of the changing healthcare environment

TUITION and CANCELLATION FEES

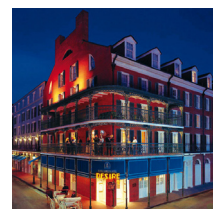
